



Please review the following 2023/2024 immunization requirements established by the Ohio Department of Health for school attendance.

Kindergarten-

5- DPT (last dose must be after 4th birthday)

4- Polio (last dose must be after 4th birthday)

- 2- MMR
- 3- Hepatitis B
- 2- Varicella

7th grade-

Tdap (must be given after child's 10th birthday)

MCV4 (meningococcal serogroup A, C, W, and Y)

12th grade-

2- MCV4 (one dose must be after age 16)

All students have fourteen (14) school days from the start of the school year to complete the necessary vaccines. Documentation must be provided to the school by September 25, 2023, from the child's physician, clinic, or other medical facility. If vaccines are not completed and appropriate documentation is not presented to the school by this date, the child will be excluded from school and all school activities (according to the Ohio Revised Code 3701.13 and 3313.671).

Students who are in grades 7 and 12 must submit proof of these vaccines in order to acquire their schedule on (August 23 or 24) the early schedule pick-up days.

Notice of Right to Know Teacher Qualifications

Dear Parent/Guardian:

You have the right to know about the teaching qualifications of your child's classroom teacher in a school receiving Title I funds. The federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act requires that any local school district receiving Title I funds must notify parents that they may ask about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher. These qualifications include:

Whether the teacher has met the Ohio teacher licensing criteria for the grade level and subject areas in which the teacher provides your child instruction.

Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or temporary status that waives state licensing requirements.

The undergraduate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate degree or certification (such as National Board Certification) held by the teacher and the field of discipline of certification or degree.

Whether your child is provided services by instructional paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.




